

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
Between The Marion County Sheriff's Office
And
The Department of Juvenile Justice
Circuit Five

This Memorandum of Agreement is entered into on this 12th day of October, 2010 by and between the Marion County Sheriff's Office (hereinafter referred to as the "Sheriff") and the State of Florida Department of Juvenile Justice (hereinafter referred to as the "Department").

WHEREAS, the Department formerly operated a Juvenile Assessment Center in and for Marion County for the processing of juvenile offenders arrested in Marion County;

WHEREAS, the Sheriff, as of August 1, 2010, has assumed the duties of processing juvenile offenders arrested in Marion County, at the Marion County Jail Juvenile Processing Area;

WHEREAS, the Department has a Live Scan device (Property Tag # 20-010371) and Imaging System (Property Tag # 13-000751) for fingerprinting, submission of fingerprints and arrest information, and the creation of an accurate criminal history for juvenile offenders arrested in Marion County, and currently not using the Live Scan device and Imaging System; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff has a need for a Live Scan device and Imaging System in the Juvenile Processing Area of the Marion County Jail.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The Department will loan the use of the Live Scan device and Imaging System to the Sheriff for its utilization in the Juvenile Processing Area of the Marion County Jail.
2. The Sheriff agrees to maintain and service the Live Scan device and Imaging System in compliance with any applicable Florida Department of Law Enforcement administrative rules and/or Florida Statutes.
3. The Sheriff agrees to bear the cost, if any, for the maintenance and servicing of the Live Scan device and Imaging System.


4. The Sheriff further agrees to maintain all supporting records associated with the utilization of the Live Scan device and Imaging System.
5. The Sheriff agrees to return the Live Scan device and Imaging System to The Department if The Department should revert back to processing youth.
6. The Department will conduct annual inventory verification according to policy.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Agreement as of the day and year as defined above.
