

Whether your child is taking part in virtual learning or heading back to the classroom, everyone can take advantage of the 2020 Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday beginning August 7 and ending August 9. During this sales tax holiday period, qualifying items will be exempt from tax, including certain school supplies selling for \$15 or less per item; clothing, footwear, and certain accessories selling for \$60 or less per item; and the first \$1,000 of the sales price of personal computers and certain computer-related accessories purchased for noncommercial home or personal use.
